GAO noted that: (1) the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporations (PBGC) principal financial problem is a large and growing deficit caused by terminations of large underfunded plans; (2) at the end of fiscal year 1991, PBGC had an estimated deficit of 2. 3 billion; (3) the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) collects 1 trillion in taxes each year, but its efforts to collect delinquent taxes have been inefficient and unbalanced, creating a serious loss of revenue; (4) the Health Care Financing Administrations inability to properly manage contractors processing Medicare claims has caused loss and waste; (5) the Customs Service did not detect about 84 percent of estimated trade law violations during fiscal year 1991 and has experienced declines in the percentage of estimated cargo violations detected since calendar year 1988; (6) the Resolution Trust Corporation has discharged some of its resolution and asset sales responsibilities well, but poor planning and execution of real estate disposition strategies have hampered its overall...
